- · All AQHA rules apply All Team members must be current members of both AQHA and CQHA.
- Team members are able to earn points at any Canadian AQHA sanctioned event held between May 1, 2022 and October 15, 2022.
- Team members are able to earn points in the Amateur divisions they are eligible to show in Walk/ Jog, Level 1, Amateur and Select.
- All points are based on the Amateur team member and not the horse/rider combo.
- A team member is able to accumulate points with multiple horses however only one set of points per class will be awarded with the exception of Halter classes.
 - If a team member shows different horses in different classes (i.e. a horse in hunter under saddle and a different horse in western pleasure) points earned in both classes will be recorded.
 - If a team member shows multiple horses in the same class, (i.e., trail) only their highest score will be recorded.
 - If a team member shows the same class (with the same horse or different horses) in multiple levels, (i.e. Level 1 trail and Amateur trail) only their placing in the class which awards the most number of points will be recorded.
 - If a team member shows multiple horses in Halter classes (i.e. Two Year Old Geldings, Three Year Old Mares, and Performance Mares) points earned in all classes will be recorded.
- Points will be calculated as follows:
 - o 1st– 10 points
 - o 2nd- 9 points
 - o 3rd-8 points
 - o 4th– 7 points
 - o 5th– 6 points
 - o 6th- 5 points
 - o 7th– 4 points
 - o 8th– 3 points
 - o 9th-2 points
 - o 1 point will be awarded for a non-placed or DQ'd entry
 - o A team member's 10 best results per class will be used for final team results.
 - Halter Grand and Reserve will be calculated as an individual class and the Grand horse will receive 10 points and the Reserve Grand Horse will receive 9 points.
- Team members can earn additional points for their team by posting about their team's sponsoring stallion on their social media platforms. They will earn one (1) point for every five (5) posts they make per platform.
- Non-Horse Activities are encouraged for each Affiliate and can be used to earn additional points for their team.
- In the event of a tie, the team winning the greatest number of firsts, then greatest number of seconds, etc. will determine the winner.
- It will be the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that all placings posted are correct and to bring any
 discrepancies to the attention of the committee. If a discrepancy occurs, it will be the show
 manager's official report that will be used to determine the correct placings. All discrepancies must
 be brought to the attention of the committee before October 26, 2022. Any issues brought forth
 after this date will not be addressed.
